Mary and Joseph had to leave their home and go to Joseph's hometown for a census.



# **Tutor Teaching Tips**

Book - "Good News!"

Multi-Levels J (1.9) and Q (3.1)

#### **BEFORE READING**

1. Have child scan the front and back covers. Have them read the title.

ASK: What do you see? What do you think the good news might be?

2. Have child page through the pictures in the book from front to back.

ASK: What do you think happens in this story? Who do you think this story is about? Who are some of the characters in the story?

When do you think this story happens - now, the past, or the future? Why?

[If the child talks about Jesus being born, ask the child what he/she already knows about it.]

<u>For older children</u> - Sometimes a book has a <u>Glossary</u> and an <u>Index</u>. ASK: Where in the book would you find the Glossary and Index? Look at the last page. ASK: What is the purpose of a Glossary? How can it help you? What is the purpose of an Index? What could you use it for? Briefly test their ability to use both the Glossary and Index by asking "What word means...?" and "On what page would you find...?"

3. Explain to the child that there are some vocabulary words in this book that they might not yet know or understand. To help prepare to read, guide the child through the <a href="https://example.com/PRE-READING VOCABULARY ACTIVITY">PRE-READING VOCABULARY ACTIVITY</a> included with this book. Be sure the child can pronounce each word and can understand it in a sentence.

#### **DURING READING**

<u>Phonics and Word Attack</u> - Help the reader work through unknown words with one or more of the following strategies:

- > Read the whole sentence and see if the context helps figure out the correct word.
- ➤ Sound out the beginning, middle, and ending sounds and then put them together (/br+ī+d–silent e/ = bride.../in+kēp+er/=innkeeper)
- Look at the illustration for clues to the word.
- Use base words and word families to figure out new words. ("heard" = base word "hear", add "-d" to make past tense; word family = hear, heard, hears, hearing, unheard)
- Break compound words apart (hometown, innkeeper, newborn, Christmas)

<u>Synonyms</u> – While reading the story, find as many words as you can that are synonyms for the word "happy" (joyful, glad, merry)

<u>Comprehension</u> – to understand:

- After each page, ask the child how the character(s) is feeling. Discuss why the character might feel that way.
- ➤ Discuss the author's theme of "good news" and discover how the news from event to event. When was the news good? Why? When was the news not so good? Why not? With what kind of news did the story start? How did it end?

**AFTER READING** – Discussions (<u>be sensitive to the various faiths and beliefs of our Whiz kids families when choosing discussion topics</u>):

- 1. Reread the last page. Discuss why people celebrate Christmas. Explain that Christ is another name for Jesus.
- 2. Who gave gifts in this story? Why do people give each other gifts on Christmas?
- 3. How do people celebrate Christmas now? Do you and your family celebrate Christmas? Talk about family traditions.
